# Annual Report of Diocesan Social Work Society for 2010-2011

## **Brief History of the Organization:**

The Diocesan Social Work Society, Lucknow (DSWS) is a registered non profit making charitable organization registered under Societies Registration Act XXI, 1860 No.855/91-92. Ever since its existence, the DSWS has been engaged in the process of empowering the poor, socially excluded and the marginalized and attempts to incarnate the social justice, peace and fullness of life to all in the structures of the society. We help the marginalized especially the women and the socially excluded population to liberate themselves and come to the mainstreams of the society. To achieve this, DSWS adopts various measures to work as an effective agent of social change. We consider this mission as our preaching of God's kingdom of Justice, Peace and Equality.

As of today, DSWS has a full time Director, Program Officer, Program Coordinator for differently able people, 4 development coordinators, one women coordinator, 10 supervisors and 65 animators who are successfully carrying out developmental programs and engaged in 400 villages of 10 districts in Uttar Pradesh.

<u>VISION</u>: We visualize a society based on Gospel values such as Justice, peace, equality and fullness of life for all.

<u>MISSION:</u> To empower the marginalized sections of society, especially the women, dalits, children and neglected in the Society, by raising their socio, economical, political, moral, spiritual and health status.

#### Name of the Chief Functionary:-

Rev. Dr. Peter Castelino (Indian) is a Diocesan Priest belongs to Lucknow Diocese. Since 1989 he has been involved in the process of empowering people. For the last 11 years he has headed the Diocesan Social Work Society, Lucknow (from its inception to 2000), has been the Associate director of Catholic Health Association (CHAI) from 2000 to 2002, the Executive Secretary of the Northern forum of the Diocesan directors (UKSVK) from 2002 to 2008, and again presently the Director of Diocesan Social work Society from 2009 and fully involved at grass root level in organizing and empowering people. He has done his post graduation in Master of Social Work from the University of Mangalore and research on "Enhancing the capacities of the NGO to work effectively" from Lucknow University.

- Awareness generation of the community through health group and health sessions.
- Animation and awareness program using puppetry, street play etc.
- Initiating the process of self help groups, CBOs and federation for the sustainability of these groups.
- Motivating health group members for regular group meetings to discuss and prioritize the identified problems such as HIV/AIDS, etc. for the growth and development of village.
- Formation of Self Help Groups, linkage with banks and inter loaning process.

- Promoting vaccination program for pregnant women and children.
- Providing linkage process to group's for getting benefit from service providers/ stake holders
- Awareness on legal literacy
- Community Rehabilitation of Differently abled.

#### **Achievements through Government Benefits:**

Through Absolute guidance and help of SHG / CBO, a huge number of the village people falling under different categories of Government Benefits; have been encouraged and helped to fill out and submit the Government forms and duly they received plenty of social benefits under different government relief schemes especially which is formulated to identify and benefit the people registered under the BPL list and those who are found in absolute poverty in the District of U.P. government; which is also the target area of DSWS consisting 32 villages.

As result of these benefits mass people of the village especially Women and Kishoris have gained self-confidence and a sense of Belongingness to the society and the Government as well. As per the project analyses they are physiologically and mentally satisfied with the benefits received by them. On the contrary many more related and neighboring village people have taken information on Government Schemes and availed benefits in due periods.

Mass number of people has great stories and witness for the working and efforts of CBO and SHG, through whom empowerment of the Human being has been initiated. Therefore, several people who receive benefits under the U.P. government schemes are as follows.

- 3 families affected by fire loss were granted 1500/- Rs each under Tatqal Relief Scheme.
- The economic status of the village people is increased.
- Income generation activities have been performed with training and about 5 women who took loan are currently earning their livelihood.
- Availability of the Loan has been made easy.
- Women participation in MANERGA is dynamic and mobilized.
- People's approach to life has been mobilized to great extent by awareness programs and training.
- 32 People of BPL list received Rickshaw trolley under the government aid.

## **Issues Covered and Outcomes:**

- 1) Eye testing for the old age people in 1 village -231 people got free eye testing and with free glasses with the help of the partner worker namely Indra Gandhi Yogna.
- 2) Information for Immunization for the pregnant women and kishoris in 19 villages. Members decided to resource and mobilized the people and get the maximum and regular vaccination of the kishoris and women and children.
- 3) Information under the Anganwadi program for children to ensure and supervise the proper and complete diet for the children in the schools under mid-day meals.
- **4**) Training on first one hour after delivery 56 participants (HC members and the SHG members) with the help Sure Start NGO.

1. Organization of the meeting on distribution of Nutrition – 212 participants – in 10 villages – Members decided to meet the Anganwadi Teacher and discuss the matter.

## **Educational Activities:**

In the area of Education there have been very remarkable activities that were performed by mainly by the Education committees that are formed and effective mobilization has been provided collectively by formed groups SHG, CBO, and federation. All have integrated their activities and motives in important area as education of the mass village people and therefore, the pace of the spreading the education to the all the castes of the villages has been very effective.

#### **Some Major Activities of the Educational Committees are:**

 $\underline{\text{Mid} - \text{Day Meals}}$  - In the educational meetings, awareness about the mid-day meals and its facilitation provided to the members, inn which 369 members participated from all the villages of IDEA project.

<u>Improvement in mid- day meals</u> – In the meetings improvement in the quality of the mid-day meals has been the main discussion. Therefore this important matter has been noted and taken to the School principal with the help and intervention of local Pradhan and Panchayat.

<u>Process</u> – When approaching the school principal, necessary changes to made in the daily menu card of the mid-meals was suggested in every village of the IDEA- Project location. In this, proper diet chart was also been suggested in some villages by proper dietitian.

<u>Results</u> - As a result of the process the, menu card was changed, and to provide better and healthy food the children, improvement in the quality of the mid- day meals has been done.

<u>Women and Kishori Education</u> – In this context, the total number of the women and Kishori who obtained basic learning to education and (specially learned signature making by writing) were 130 participated from 26 villages in the regular educational classes. It was observed that many more women and kishori were encouraged to learn and write watching their fellow friends and neighbors. Kishori education received by 322 kishoris.

<u>Education Scheme</u> – Under the Savitri bhai phule Educational Scheme, about 60 women received the benefits of the aid and were educated under specific school.

<u>Educational Awareness</u> – The awareness about the education has been also provided by the program called Puppet show in which the basic theme was education to all is the democratic right of the people. The responses from these programs have been very effective in changing the physiological mentality of the people towards education of the women and the Girls.

<u>Baalwadi Activity</u> – Under the Baalwadi program of the government, the education is widely spreading. Baalwadi Kendra presently working for children education 15. Baalwadi members presently in 32 villages is 230 ( where 130 are girls and 100 boys)

<u>Right to Education</u> – The basic information provided to mass village people on right to education is 1,788.

<u>Basic Education</u> – Through Baalwadi program the basic alphabet writing and learning were facilitated to 520 children.

## **PEARL project:**

Changes in the context of project purpose / objective : (in bullet points)

Achievements and perspectives of the project according to the specific objectives and indicators as defined

- As regards the stated objectives of improving livelihood conditions and creating opportunities for a certain number of rickshaw pullers and construction workers, the project fell short ensuring the slated numbers of Voter ID and Ration Cards issued. It was largely because of the failure of our target group to provide proof of their residential status. This was identified as 'risk' at the time project formulation. Nevertheless, we are putting in efforts to achieve the projected objective as reported in column 7.
- Substantial progress has been made in the direction of ensuring inclusion of rickshaw pullers and construction workers in the development process. We have issues of rickshaw pullers and construction workers raised at appropriate forum: the charter of demand submitted to the mayor of Lucknow. As many as eight applications under RTI were submitted. Twelve CBOs have been formed under the banner of 'Asangathit Rickshaw Chalak Evam Mazdoor Kalyan Manch'. The rate list has already been formed and submitted to LNN for endorsement. An effort has also been made to submit the charter of demand to the Minister of Urban Development. Besides, there have been alliances with human rights and civil society organizations. All these together have resulted in not only empowerment of our target groups but created certain level of responsiveness and a sense of accountability among the government functionaries.

#### Changes in the context of development impact: (in bullet points)

Changes related to impact on Social, economical and ecological progress (eg role of women, knowledge and awareness, participation and power of the marginalized, poverty ecological sustainability)

- In explicit terms, we had the agenda of social change enshrined in the project objectives. And this is being evidenced by the involvement of women of rickshaw pullers and workers families at almost all the levels.
- They invariably registered their presence right from the base line survey to programmatic interventions, viz. filling up the application forms for Ration and Voters ID Cards, awareness meetings, preparation of rate boards, signature and IEC campaigns. Celebration of International Human Rights Day, World Food Day, Women's day, May Day etc., besides, of course, in the self-help group processes.
- ➤ The participation of women and the entire community in the program has resulted in destabilizing in not out rightly changing the existing relation of power in their respective

settlements by virtue of information and knowledge of their rights, their strength as a community, as an organization.





## Vistar program:

## **Supportive Supervision:-**

Sector meeting is a capacity building platform of the AWWs as well as addressing and solving the problem of the AWWs. Sector meeting is a place to circulate the common massage to all the AWWs. Sector meetings conducted by the ICDS supervisors on the scheduled date in a month in each sector at ICDS block office. We have conducted VHND and Equity & Gender training in the sector meetings in this year.

Sector meeting is a Regular activity in ICDS project. A total no of 801 sector meetings were organized from the month of April 2010 to March 2011. 20695 AWWs were present in these sector meetings. VISTAAR team (D.S.W.S. staff and SPM- C.R.S.) have attended 643 sector meetings.





# **Achievements:-**

- Meetings conducting on the regular basic on scheduled date.
- Quality of Sector meetings have improved.

- Actively participation of CDPOs and Supervisors has increased.

AWWs Center Visits:- Main objective of the AWWs center visits are strengthening the properly operationalization of AWWs centers, providing support to improve the counseling skills, to promote on site counseling, help in addressing the problems during running the centers. AWWs centers are visiting by the project team and filling an AWW feedback format. A total no of 1657 Anganawadi centers have visited by BNFs from the month of August 10 to March 2011. 1237 (75%) AWCs feedback formats have filled out of 1657 visited centers. 692 (42%) AWCs were found closed and 965 (58%) of the AWWs center were found opened. Earlier the no of closed center were higher, but after the intervention of VISTAAR the no of opened centers have increased.

## **Village Health and Nutrition Day (VHND): -**

In the year 2010-11, the focus has been on strengthening the operationalization of Village Health and Nutrition Days which was started in the previous year. This has included a wide range of initiatives beginning with strengthening the process of micro planning for VHND- jointly by Health and ICDS officials and functionaries, with emphasis on maximum number of AWCs as VHND sites. Training of AWW and their Supervisors on VHND has been a major step towards supporting the implementation. VHND session observation was streamlined and feedback sharing was done with a fair regularity at the block and district level convergence meetings. Implementation of the Jachcha Bachcha Swasthya Abhiyan (JBSA) in Uttar Pradesh, has also given an added impetus to the roll out of activities under VHND. Jachcha Bachcha Swasthya Abhiyan (JBSA) program is





implementing in the district from the month of August 2010.

VHND sessions are randomly observed by the staff of Diocesan Social work Society on each and every Wednesday and Saturday of the month as well as by the Government functionaries like- Health and ICDS departments.

Analysis of 3038 VHND sessions in Gonda district randomly observed by Government functionaries and USAID supported VISTAAR Project between April'10 and March'11 in Gonda, shows that there has been an overall improvement in the sessions being organized with 79% percent of the sessions held as planned in the VHND micro-plan (fixed day and site) as against 84% of the held sessions from April'10 to March'11.

## **Achievements:-**

- Percentages of held sessions have increased.
- Percentage of VHND sessions held as per micro plan have increased.
- Presences of three front line workers have increased.
- Co-ordination between health, ICDS have increased.
- Participation and involvement of ICDS department have increased.

## **District Convergence meeting:-**

A VHND convergence meeting conducts in a month at district level in C.M.O. (Family Welfare). The main objective of the meeting is to share the analysis of the observed VHND sessions during the last month with the district functionaries, addressing the issues, increasing the co-ordination between the concerning departments and the status of the blocks. The meeting well represent by the district level officials of Health, ICDS, MCHIP and VISTAAR. C.M.O. (Family Welfare) chairs this meeting.

#### **Achievements:-**

- Logistic / medical equipment kit (Blood Pressure equipment, Weighing scale for adult, Hemoglobin meter, Uris tic, Hydrochloride solution, Sugar testing kit etc.) for ANMs have purchased and distributed to all ANMs in the district.
- ❖ Left out sessions due to pulse polio round and Holiday are conducting in the next coming day or month.
- ❖ Co-ordination between health, ICDS and Education has increased.

#### **Block Convergence meeting:-**

To improve the Quality, coverage area through increasing the co-ordination between health, ICDS, Education and P.R.I departments, sharing the analysis of the observed VHND sessions during the last month with the block functionaries, addressing the issues. The meeting well represent by the officials of Health, ICDS, Education, P.R.I and *VISTAAR*. Medical Superintendents/ Medical officer in-charge chairs these meeting. Health and Education officer are responsible to organize the block convergence meeting on the block. Altogether in this year 181 Block level convergence meetings are held.

# **Liliane Foundation program**

We work with altogether 171 differently disabled children. Most of the children are studying in different institutions according to the facilities provided and some of them are at their own houses. Hearing Impaired children are in Thakurganj studying in St. Francis for the Hearing Impaired school and staying in the boarding, Visually Impaired children are studying in Nav Jyoti School & Hostel for the Visually Impaired Mohanlalganj, Mentally Retardation children are studying in Navdeep

School for Special Education Hussianganj and Physically Handicapped children are in their own houses and study in the different schools. All these children are taken care and looked after well in the institutions and the children those who are in their own houses they are guided by the mediator and the animators those who work in the same area .they do the regular visit of each children and parents, thus they are well aware of the utilization of the given money and the materials.
