## **Annual Report of Diocesan Social Work Society for 2013-2014**

#### **Brief History of the Organization:**

The Diocesan Social Work Society, Lucknow (DSWS) is a registered nonprofit making charitable organization registered under Societies Registration Act XXI, 1860 No.855/91-92. Ever since its existence from 1989, the DSWS has been engaged in the process of empowering the poor, socially excluded and the marginalized and attempts to incarnate the social justice, peace and fullness of life to all in the structures of the society. We facilitate the marginalized especially the women and the socially excluded population to liberate themselves and come to the mainstreams of the society. To achieve this, DSWS adopts various measures to work as an effective agent of social change. We consider this mission as our preaching of God's kingdom of Justice, Peace and Equality.

As of today, DSWS has a full time Director, a full time Asst. Director, 3 Program Coordinators, 1 Asst. Coordinator, 20 animators are working 83 villages of one districts (Barabanki).

<u>VISION:</u> We visualize a society based on Gospel values such as Justice, peace, equality and fullness of life for all.

<u>MISSION:</u> To empower the marginalized sections of society, especially the women, dalits, children and neglected in the Society, by raising their socio, economical, political, moral, spiritual and health status.

## Days are celebrated by Diocesan Social Work Society (DSWS) Lucknow –

International women's day celebrated by ADHIKAR, DEWA and GAD in Lucknow diocese at project level, 700-750people participated in this program. ICDS of Barabanki was invited as chief guest she talked about women's rights and government policies which is for women's welfare. Cultural program was performed by adolescent girls.

Children's day called *Baal Mela* was celebrated on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2012 at Junior High School Teergaun. Total 326 children, 58 parents, three G.P. Pradhans and 14 teachers were present in Baal Mela. The Pradhans and teachers gave full support for organizing this program. The children put up one role play on importance of Girls' education for the development. The children presented cultural program (dance, speech, and role play) on the Social Gender and education.

**Christmas Milan:** people of Harakh block Barabanki district witnessed first time Christmas this year. Under the help of diocesan V.G Rev. Fr. Ignatius D'souza and cathedral youth celebrated grand Christmas event in Shekvapur village school campus.

Under the **Aashirvad Bal Swasthaya Garanti Yojna (ABSGY)** 411 children underwent health checkup. In this yojna govt. provided health checkup for children between 6-14 years old.

Under right to education act through ADHIKAR project 179 children have been enrolled in primary school.

Three centers for vocational and non formal education have been established in Harakh block by efforts of Lucknow diocese. Two centre's for tailoring and one for beautician.

# **Integrated Development Project – Nanpara Objectives:**

- To enable the marginalized communities to have access to basic and specialized health care services undertaken by the Government.
- To empower the people in the target area socially and economically.
- To enable the people to tap avail Govt. schemes by the end of the project period.
- To raise the literacy rate by enabling the children between the age group of 6-15 belonging to marginalized groups of the target area start attending primary education by the end of project period.
- To improve the capacity of the people in target area in decision making power and exercising their rights.

#### Empowering Actions with the Excluded and the Disadvantaged for Entitlements.

**Location:-**50 villages of Dewa block.

Goal:-Reduction in the barriers to inclusion of Scheduled Castes, Muslims, Poor, Women, disabled and empowering them for their entitlements beyond of the project.

#### **Objectives:-**

- The women leaders taken action against Gram Sabha and block level officials for their rights through advocacy and rights based approach by end of 3<sup>rd</sup> year.
- 70% card holder families from the excluded community get 20 to 50 days work in a year under MNREGA and all families get their basic entitlements from PDS system by end of project by end of 3<sup>rd</sup> year.
- To reduce the number of girls and the children with special need out of the schools of the excluded community (Muslim) in the target Area by end of end of 3<sup>rd</sup> year.
- To Reduce MMR and IMR in the excluded community to 50% from the present situation by end of 3<sup>rd</sup> year.
- To strengthen the groups of the excluded community to interact with the different stakeholders of civil society to get their basic rights (advocacy) by end of 3<sup>rd</sup> year.

#### Major Achievement:-

- Appointment of all staff (One Coordinator, 1 Accountant, one Assistant Coordinator and 10 animators) in the project.
- All staff learned about project objectives and activities with implement strategic.
- Collected baseline survey data of project area.
- 10 Gram Panchayats people made aware about tight to education, right to work (MNREGA), right to health and right to food security through puppet show.

  Major activity conducted:-
- Lunching of the project.

- Organized interview for selection of the new coordinator and animators.
- Organized of Initial training for staff.
- Organized field orientation for staff.
- Collected of basic data in the project area through base line survey.
- Organized 10 puppet shows in the project area.
- Organized community meeting on the formation of the different types groups (Women self help group, Adolescent girls group and C.B.O.

#### The Liliane Fonds

The Liliane Foundation's key objective is to ensure that children with disabilities in developing countries take a full and active part in everyday life, joining in family and community activities. In order to achieve this, our local partners play a crucial role. In Lucknow Diocese we work and support disabled children both in institutions and community. We are assisting altogether 148 children. Most of the children are studying in the Institutions. 42 Visually Impaired children are in "Navjyothi School" Mohanlalganj. 49 Hearing Impaired children are in St. Francis School, Thakurganj. 11 mentally retarded children in "Navdeep School" Hussainganj. 46 children are supported in their own houses. Those places are Gosaiganj, Barabanki and Nigohan. We do the home visits and try to ensure that children with disabilities are able to maximize their physical and mental abilities to access regular services and opportunities & to become active contributors to the community and society at large. We are glad to see the progress in education and attitudinal change in the children with disabilities and their community.

We are planning to move more to the community level participation by forming DPO and Community Help Centre for disabled persons in Gosaiganj soon.

We are grateful to The Catholic Diocese of Lucknow for giving an opportunity to help the dropout and uneducated children in remote areas of the diocese. This is a micro project supported by diocese which is implemented in the Harakh block of Barabanki District. The project is aimed to give integrated development and education of adolescent girls. Especially for the dropout not school going girls are given life skill training. There are four centers opened in which 93 dropout girls and 39 illiterate adolescent girls receive coaching, tailoring, or beautician training. We also conduct seminar, health camps and meetings with the children and parents. Information about Centers:
