Brief History of the Organization:

The Diocesan Social Work Society, Lucknow (DSWS) is a registered nonprofit making charitable organization registered under Societies Registration Act XXI, 1860 No.855/91-92. Ever since its existence from 1989, the DSWS has been engaged in the process of empowering the poor, socially excluded and the marginalized and attempts to incarnate the social justice, peace and fullness of life to all in the structures of the society. We facilitate the marginalized especially the women and the socially excluded population to liberate themselves and come to the mainstreams of the society. To achieve this, DSWS adopts various measures to work as an effective agent of social change. We consider this mission as our preaching of God's kingdom of Justice, Peace and Equality.

As of today, DSWS has a full time Director, a full time Asst. Director, a Program Manger, 4 Program Coordinators, 2 supervisors, 35 animators are working 133 villages of two districts (Barabanki and Baharaich)



VISION: We visualize a society based on Gospel values such as Justice, peace, equality and fullness of life for all.

MISSION: To empower the marginalized sections of society, especially the women, dalits, children and neglected in the Society, by raising their socio, economical, political, moral, spiritual and health status.

Christmas and New Year day celebrations:



International women's day celebrated by ADHIKAR and GAD in Lucknow diocese at project level, 700-750 people participated in this program. DPO of Barabanki was invited as chief guest she talked about women's rights and government policies which is for women's welfare. Cultural program was performed by adolescent girls.



Children's day called **BAL Mela** was celebrated on 2nd December 2012 at Junior High School Teergaw. Total 326 children, 58 parents, three G.P. Pradhans and 14 teachers were present in BAL Mela. The Pradhans and teachers gave full support for organizing this program. The children put up one role play on importance of Girls' education for the development. The children presented cultural program (dance, speech, and role play) on the Social Gender and education.



Under the Aashirvad Bal Swasthaya Garanti Yojna (ABSGY) 411 children underwent health checkup. In this yojna govt. provided health checkup for children between 6-14 years old.

Under right to education act through ADHIKAR project 179 children have been enrolled in primary school.

Three centers for vocational and non formal education have been established in Harakh block by efforts of Lucknow diocese. Two centre's for tailoring and one for beautician.

Integrated Development Project – Nanpara

Objectives:

- To enable the marginalized communities to have access to basic and specialized health care services undertaken by the Government.
- To empower the people in the target area socially and economically.
- To enable the people to tap avail Govt. schemes by the end of the project period.
- To raise the literacy rate by enabling the children between the age group of 6-15 belonging to marginalized groups of the target area start attending primary education by the end of project period.
- To improve the capacity of the people in target area in decision making power and exercising their rights.

The main activities undertaken during the year 2012 – 2013 are:

1. Creating awareness regarding health issues, education, right to health facilities available and the government schemes through mass media, puppetry etc.

3. Training on Communicable diseases

Extension of community health program in 60 villages in Gosainganj block

Location :- 60 villages of Gosainganj block District-lucknow.

Objectives:-

- To Ensure and enable that all the poor and the needy class have access to basic and specialized health care services undertaken by the Govt. on regular basis.
- To promote preventive and precautionary methods through the medium of health education seminars and practical training to the local health workers and villagers.
- To promote the use of indigenous herbal medicines.
- To enable the people to tap the government medical facilities such as immunization and other schemes specially meant for the welfare of pregnant women, Children and Kishori's.
- To promote re-productive system and child health.
- To promote self-confidence leadership skills and fraternity.
- To spread the awareness thorough regular programs about HIV/AIDS, STD diseases other communicable diseases.

Major Achievements of the Gosaiganj project:-

- 85% the poor and needy class people are now getting health facilities and its entitlements from the Govt. hospitals in the project area.
- 60% people of project area are using of indigenous herbal medicine.
- 90% children getting immunization with timely.
- 90% pregnant women getting T.T. vaccination with timely.
- 95% pregnant women prefer to intuitional delivery in project area.
- 65% the people make aware about prevention and protection from HIV & AIDS.
- 85% the people of venerable community are make aware and they have action by self for getting their rights and entitlements.
- 70% the women of project area improve their self confidence and leadership skill at all level special during decision making in family or society.
- Total 79 self help groups, 37 Adolescent girl groups, 23 federations of SHG and 60 C.B.Os., are exist in the project area.
- 70% people of the community makes aware about reproductive system and child health.
- 80% families are caring and given support of women during her pregnancy period.

Adikhar Project at Harakh

Location: - 21 Villages of Harakh Block,

Project Objective:-

- 100% eligible pregnant women, children and lactating mothers are obtaining their due entitlements under health by end of project period.
- 100% Children will have improved their literacy level and quality of education by availing entitlements under RTE by end of project period.

Major Achievements of project:-

1. 100% children got educational entitlement in the project area.
2. 11 SMC reactivated in this year.
3. 80% parents have started visiting the schools for the getting feedback from teachers about their children education level.
4. 179 children enrolled in Govt. primary school through Adhikar project.
5. 411 children benefited from health check-up under Ashirvad Bal Swathy Guaranty Yojana.
6. 845 children benefited from measles vaccination under National Measles Control Campaign.
7. 5 AWC are opening and closing as per norms of Govt.
8. 9 Govt. Schools have started to follow MDM menu according to Govt. norms.

9. 75 % target Beneficiaries registered at AWC/ANM in this year.

Empowering Actions with the Excluded and the Disadvantaged for Entitlements.

Location:-50 villages of Dewa block.

Goal:-Reduction in the barriers to inclusion of Scheduled Castes, Muslims, Poor, Women, disabled and empowering them for their entitlements beyond of the project.

Objectives:-

- The women leaders taken action against Gram Sabha and block level officials for their rights through advocacy and rights based approach by end of 3rd year.
- 70% card holder families from the excluded community get 20 to 50 days work in a year under MNREGA and all families get their basic entitlements from PDS system by end of project by end of 3rd year.
- To reduce the number of girls and the children with special need out of the schools of the excluded community (Muslim) in the target Area by end of end of 3rd year.
- To Reduce MMR and IMR in the excluded community to 50% from the present situation by end of 3rd year.
- To strengthen the groups of the excluded community to interact with the different stakeholders of civil society to get their basic rights (advocacy) by end of 3rd year.

Major Achievement:-

- Appointment of all staff (One Coordinator, 1 Accountant, one Assistant Coordinator and 10 animators) in the project.
- All staff learned about project objectives and activities with implement strategic.
- Collected baseline survey data of project area.
- 10 Gram Panchayats people made aware about tight to education, right to work (MNREGA), right to health and right to food security through puppet show.

Major activity conducted:-

- Lunching of the project.
- Organized interview for selection of the new coordinator and animators.
- Organized of Initial training for staff.
- Organized field orientation for staff.
- Collected of basic data in the project area through base line survey.
- Organized 10 puppet shows in the project area.
- Organized community meeting on the formation of the different types groups (Women self help group, Adolescent girls group and C.B.O.

The Liliane Fonds

The Liliane Foundation's key objective is to ensure that children with disabilities in developing countries take a full and active part in everyday life, joining in family and community activities. In order to achieve this, our local partners play a crucial role. In Lucknow

Diocese we work and support disabled children both in institutions and community. We are assisting altogether 148 children. Most of the children are studying in the Institutions. 42 Visually Impaired children are in “Navjyothi School” Mohanlalganj. 49 Hearing Impaired children are in St. Francis School, Thakurganj. 11 mentally retarded children in “Navdeep School” Hussainganj. 46 children are supported in their own houses. Those places are Gosaiganj, Barabanki and Nigohan. We do the home visits and try to ensure that children with disabilities are able to maximize their physical and mental abilities to access regular services and opportunities & to become active contributors to the community and society at large. We are glad to see the progress in education and attitudinal change in the children with disabilities and their community.

Objectives:-

- Enhanced life skills and vocational skills.
- Enhanced information and exposure to adolescent girls.
- Increased quality modules & materials available for use to adolescent girls.
- Improved facilitation towards the realization of gender policy
- Increased state attention on the enhancement of adolescent girls.

We are grateful to The Catholic Diocese of Lucknow for giving an opportunity to help the dropout and uneducated children in remote areas of the diocese. This is a micro project supported by diocese which is implemented in the Harakh block of Barabanki District. The project is aimed to give integrated development and education of adolescent girls. Especially for the dropout not school going girls are given life skill training. There are four centers opened in which 93 dropout girls and 39 illiterate adolescent girls receive coaching, tailoring, or beautician training. We also conduct seminar, health camps and meetings with the children and parents.

Micro Project at Uchawalia: Basic education for 100 children

The Objectives

1. To create a culture of education among the low caste children.
2. To create awareness about health and hygiene; especially child health care, village hygiene, nutritious food for children, etc.
3. To minimize and stop child labor.
4. To develop the latent talents of children.
5. To make children's clubs and study groups in different villages.
6. To instill in children moral values.
7. To enroll all children in the regular school.

Activities undertaken:

1. At the beginning, the animators and teachers went around all the villages and sensitized the parents about education and encouraged children to join the regular school or our centre.
2. We had experienced that early parents used to send them for some odd works instead of sending the children for studies. Our centres have inculcated in parents and children an understanding of education
3. We run these centers to motivate children and parents to education. The purpose is to enroll the children in the regular school and to establish a culture of education in these villages
4. We conduct term examinations. Each NFE centre has two exams in a year. We have exams on Hindi, English, Mathematics, Music, Cleanliness and General Knowledge.
5. Teachers follow syllabi which is suitable for the NFE centres and student friendly.
6. Every day we have assembly, checking of cleanliness, P.T. and group games. Saturdays are specially set apart for music, cultural activities and sports and games.
7. We distributed uniform clothe for every child.
8. Parents and children are sensitized to education.
9. We have 70 to 80 per cent success in enrolling children to regular schools. It is not only the children but the people of the area appreciate it. The improvement is visible.
